Outline for Research Paper

Now that you are aware of what a credible source is and have had time since our last class to find credible sources, use them to create an outline for your research paper. What do I want in this outline?

- Your thesis statement should be the first bullet point
- Your subtopics. Example: If you are writing about colors, what points are you going to cover about colors?
- A list of your sources (copy and paste) Make sure you and I can understand them.
- Main information gathered from your sources (articles) that you will be using in your paper.
 - At this point, this information can be pulled directly from the source. Don't worry about
 the proper format. You can just copy and paste the important information in your
 outline. Although, try to change the text font and size to match your outline; don't have
 18 point font BOLD in the middle of a 12 point font outline.
- Add anything else in this outline that will make the transition between outline and research paper smooth. This is for your benefit.
