

Recap Today's class was an introduction to grammar and the 8 parts of speech. As a reminder:

The 8 Parts of Speech:

- <u>noun</u> A noun is the name of a person, place, thing, or idea.
 - Proper nouns always start with a capital letters; common nouns do not.
- pronoun A pronoun is a word used in place of a noun.
- Substituted for a specific noun, which is called its antecedent
- verb expresses action or being
 - There is a main verb and sometimes one or more helping verbs. ("She can sing." Sing is the main verb; can is the helping verb.)
- adjective modifies or describes a noun or pronoun.
 - usually answers the question of which one, what kind, or how many
- adverb modifies or describes a verb, an adjective, or another adverb
 - usually answers the questions of when, where, how, why, under what conditions, or to what degree. Adverbs often end in -ly.
- <u>preposition</u> word placed before a noun or pronoun to form a phrase modifying another word in the sentence.
 - almost always functions as an adjective or as an adverb.
- conjunction joins words, phrases, or clauses
 - Coordinating conjunctions connect grammatically equal elements: and, but, or, nor, for, so, yet.
 - Subordinating conjunctions connect clauses that are not equal: because, although, while, since, etc
- interjection word used to express emotion
- used to express emotion. It is often followed by an exclamation point.
