#### **URLs**

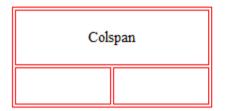
- URL stands for Ultimate Resource Location (or web page address, in plain English);
- Parts of the URL: http://www.schoolnova.org/student\_area/john/index.html?search=homework
  - http:// protocol or schema
  - www.schoolnova.org domain name (the organization that controls domain names is called ICANN)
  - /student\_area/john/index.html path
  - ?search=homework query string

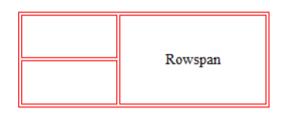
### **Tables**

```
Header 1
 Header 2
row 1, cell 1
 row 1, cell 2
row 2, cell 1
 row 2, cell 2
```

- Table and TR tags can have a "width" attribute.
- The "width" attribute value can be expressed in percentages of the container (e.g. width="25%") or in pixels (e.g. width="200").
- TR and TD tags can have the "align" attribute, the values of which can be "left (default), right, center or justified.
