## Are you worthy of a better grade?

Now that we have discussed the question (Are you deserving/worthy of an education?) and the ways to approach your answer, I want you to start polishing up your work. What does "polishing up" look like?

Make sure you read all my comments. You don't have to agree with all my suggestions. I am not trying to take your work and make it my own. But if it tells you to change "your" to "you're," because it's a grammatically incorrect, you may want to do that. Also, see where you are *not* answering the question. As I suggested in class, go through each sentence, and ask yourself, does this sentence answer the question? When you write "I deserve or I am worthy of an education because I do well in school," That alone does not answer the question.

As a BENEFIT or a CURSE, you can add to your work, if you wish. Explain your answer more <u>but *beware* of going off topic or explaining yourself too much</u>. If you stay with the same word count, that is fine, you will not lose credit.

Three pages vs. one paragraph is seen in the same light. Just be clear.
