


Researching the Lives and Words of Poets

## WHAT IS AN AUTHOR STUDY?

An author study is an in-depth exploration of a poet's life and work. During this project, you will:

- Research their biography: Important life events and influences.
- Analyze their themes: Big ideas in their poetry (e.g., love, nature, identity).
- Understand their style: How they write (structure, imagery, rhythm).
- Write about one of their most famous poems: Its meaning, themes, and style.

Purpose: Understand the connection between a poet's life and their poetry.



# WHY STUDY POETS?

 Poetry reflects deep emotions, ideas, and culture.

 Learn how a poet's life influences their voice and themes. • Practice reading and analyzing poetic language.

 Discover the power of words to inspire and connect us.



### HOW TO CHOOSE A POET



# STEP 1: THINK ABOUT YOUR INTERESTS

- What topics interest you?
  - Love, nature, identity, social justice, etc.
- Do you prefer classic or modern poetry?

#### STEP 2: RESEARCH POETS

- Explore poets from different backgrounds and styles.
  - Suggested poets:
    - Maya Angelou, Robert
      Frost, Langston Hughes,
      Emily Dickinson,
      Amanda Gorman, Shel
      Silverstein.

# STEP 3: NARROW YOUR CHOICES

- Pick a poet whose themes or style you connect with.
- Ensure there are enough resources available about them.

## GETTING STARTED WITH RESEARCH

#### Step 1: Learn About the Poet's Life

- Research their background:
  - Where and when did they live?
  - What experiences shaped their work?

#### Step 2: Select a Poem to Analyze

- Choose one of their most famous or meaningful works.
- Look for themes, style, and meaning in the poem.

#### Step 3: Use Reliable Sources

• Books, articles, and credible websites are great starting points.



## THE CRAAP METHOD FOR EVALUATING RESOURCES

CRAAP helps you evaluate the quality of your sources.

Currency: Is the information up-to-date?

• When was it published or last updated?

Relevance: Does it relate to your research?

• Is it detailed and appropriate for your grade level?

Authority: Who is the author or publisher?

• Are they credible or experts on the topic?

Accuracy: Is the information true?

• Are there sources cited? Does it match other reliable information?


Purpose: Why was it written?

• Is it to inform, persuade, or sell something? Look for bias.

Tip: Double-check your sources before using them in your paper.

## RESEARCH PAPER BREAKDOWN

- Your research paper will include:
- Introduction
  - o Introduce the poet and their significance.
- Biography
  - Summarize their life story and influences.
- Poem Analysis
  - Choose one poem and discuss:
    - What it's about.
    - Themes and imagery.
    - The poet's style and technique.
- Conclusion
  - o Reflect on their contributions to poetry and why their work matters.








## TOOLS FOR SUCCESS

Reliable Sources: Use library databases, books, and trusted websites.

Organize Your Notes: Write down key details under categories like "Biography" and "Poetry Themes."




Ask for Help: Ms. Martocello or your local librarian can guide you if you're unsure where to start.



Pick Your Poet and Find One Source

- 3. Write down the source information (title, author, URL, etc.) and submit via google form.
